In addition to showing part of our collection of historical scenes along the Donner Pass route and swapping stories with retired SP employees, we enjoyed viewing the display of rolling stock brought to Truckee for Railroad Days. Western Pacific F-7 805A looked especially smashing, and it was pure enjoyment to feel the rumble of her idling engine as we toured the cab. Kudos to Dave McClain and his Portola Museum coworkers for the job they did on restoration of the 805A. Incidentally, when purchased, this engine was in basically the same condition as the two SP F-7's now at Golden Gate Railroad Museum. These latter

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engines are the ones PSRHS would like to see restored and displayed in Colfax or other locations along the Donner route, where they saw service in Black Widow colors.

Meeting Minutes August 26, 2004:

Meeting Commenced at 7:10 P.M. at the First Congregational Church in Auburn.

Announcements-

- President Roger Staab announced 2 dates of possible interest.
- (1) Truckee Railroad Days on September 11-12, where the P.S.R.H.S. will share an information booth with another group.
- (2) Colfax Founders Day on September 18th, where the main focuses will be the dedication of a plaque on the old freight depot. Also planned are historical walking tours and the caboose will be manned by P.S.R.H.S.
- Member Frank Thomy announced that he is exhibiting his railroad models in the Auburn Art Walk Program. If interested, call Frank at (530) 887-8973 for more information.
- Vice-President Jim Wood announced that the next field trip would begin where the July 2003 left off. (In the vicinity of Lake Rollins where the Nevada Narrow Gauge crossed the Bear River.) From there, the group will travel the service road to Cape Horn with the assistance of Brendan Compton. Next on the agenda will be the site of the famous Secret Ravine trestle and the American Canyon viewpoint to the American River. After a discussion of possible

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dates, it was agreed to schedule the outing for Saturday, October 2. Details following in this newsletter.

• The regular October meeting will be a joint session with the Colfax Area Historical Society on October 21^{s.}

Old Business-

- Jim Wood reported that the Colfax City Council has officially endorsed the acquisition of rolling stock for historical display and is currently negotiating a lease with U.P. for a spur line for that purpose.
- Roger issued a reminder that the P.S.R.H.S.'s area of interest is not restricted to Colfax, but the entire mainline route from Roseville to Truckee. Accordingly, we should always be on the lookout for opportunities to develop other sites of historic interest along that portion of the mainline. He also encouraged donations by members for specific projects of personal interest.

New Business-

- Member Shelton Campbell raised the question of how the P.S.R.H.S. might interface its activities with the Auburn Chamber of Commerce and it's rolling stock display adjacent to its offices at the old train depot. Shelton had taken part in refurbishing the caboose at an earlier date and questions the fact that the 2 box cars there are still lettered with Northwest markings. Roger indicated he would look into the matter.
- Roger pointed out that members should begin thinking about the election of officers in November and what type of meeting (dinner and/or program) should be considered for

the annual meeting in December. A location also has to be determined.

Program-

P.S.R.H.S. member Shelton Campbell, a life-long railroad buff and modeler, historian and excursion taker, first commented on the history and operation of the California Zephyr, the W.P. streamliner that ran in the 1950's and 60's. He then showed the video he made while taking part in the excursion which took place on the weekend of April 15-18. The consist, originating in Emeryville on Friday, included W.P. 806 and 5 original CZ cars, and made it's first run to Sparks. Shelton boarded the train in Sparks at 8 A.M. on Saturday for it's second leg, a run to Colfax and back, with lunch served aboard. After arriving back in Sparks around 5:30P.M. it next began it's dinner run to Truckee and back, and returned to Emeryville on it's final leg on Sunday. Shelton's video successfully captured the sights and sounds of travel in that by-gone era and included crew activities as well. He also brought along his HO scale model of the California Zephyr as well as promotional and reference material.

Meeting concluded at approximately 8:30 P.M. Attendance consisted of 19 members and 2 guests.
