#### **Donner Route Abbreviated History Booklets**

At the August meeting, many PSRHS members picked up your complimentary copy of the new PSRHS-published booklet, *The Donner Pass Route of the Transcontinental Railroad, An Abbreviated History.* Additional copies will be available at the September meeting for those members who have not received their copy. Niles Canyon Railway Several PSRHS members took part in a special September 11 event on the Niles Canyon Railway. The Pacific Locomotive Association hosted members of the various railroad groups in Northern California for a special excursion through Niles canyon, including a tour of their yard and their numerous pieces of rolling stock.

On summer weekends, the Niles Canyon Railway offers either steam or diesel one-hour excursions from Sunol (SW of Livermore in the bay area) to Niles in the Fremont suburbs, and return to Sunol. They also operate during the winter months, but less frequently.

Their motive power includes a steam engine from the Quincy Junction Railroad, and several SP and WP diesels in gleaming restored condition. If you have not already discovered this interesting excursion line, I encourage you to check them out.

It was very interesting to view first-hand what a dedicated group of volunteers has been able to accomplish. Incidentally, the PLA points out that the Niles Canyon route was part of the original transcontinental railroad, before the bay route was built from Oakland to Sacramento via Martinez. The roadbed through Niles canyon dates to 1865.
