### President s Column: Looking Ahead to 2006

I feel privileged to succeed Roger Staab as the President of the PSRHS organization for 2006. Roger, and Mike Ramsey before him, has done a marvelous job in moving our group forward in the last two years of existence as a historical society. I will attempt to equal their performance.

This January 2006 marks the beginning of the fifth year since our incorporation. Up to now we have been involved with many interesting and important activities related to the PSRHS Mission which is the preservation and interpretation of the history of railroading in the Placer County area of the Sierras and in particular the Donner Pass Route of the Transcontinental Railroad. These diverse activities have included:

- Many field trips to relocate historic and forgotten locales of the Central Pacific Railroad.
- Research and reproduction of historic photos of the railroads in our area of interest for public display and education.
- Publication of local railroad history in booklets for distribution to the public.
- Direct involvement in the restoration of important railroad structures, i.e., the Colfax Depot.
- Establishment of an attractive website publicizing our activities in railroad history preservation.
- Monthly meetings with presentations of interesting railroad history.
- Focus on the restoration of railroad rolling stock.

Not because of lack of interest, our group has been involved in rolling stock restoration up to this time as we have been focused on getting our organization well established and building credibility in the local region as a respectable historic society. Our philosophy has been to not overextend ourselves and take one step at a time. Now appears to be the time to go to the next step.

2006 could bring a big change in our involvement in this last type of activity and take our organization in new directions. As our membership has grown to between 40 and 50 individual members, we have collected people with the desire and skills required to tackle rolling stock restoration. Circumstances in Colfax may allow our group to finally establish ourselves in the business of railroad equipment restoration.

Late last year we sent Union Pacific Railroad in Omaha a proposal for PSRHS to enter into a joint land use agreement to create an outdoor railroad museum for the purpose of restoring and displaying railroad equipment. The initial response from UP has been favorable to our proposal. We have been benefited in our request to UP by the overwhelming support of the City of Colfax.

We are hopeful that in 2006 our negotiations with UP will conclude. We will then be in a position to acquire railroad equipment and rolling stock with important relevance to the Donner Pass Route or the Transcontinental Railroad or to railroading in the Central Sierras in general.

Many of our members have been looking forward to the day when our organization could be involved in eliminating the void in this type of activity for preserving the history of the Donner Pass Route. We believe that if we can get established in this type of activity and attract the publics attention, our organization s membership will rapidly grow. Here s hoping for another productive year in 2006 for PSRHS.
