# February 2008 Newsletter

### January Meeting Presentations:

A discussion was held regarding choices for this year's field trips. It was decided that the Spring trip will be to Newcastle. Probable date will be Saturday May 31<sup>st</sup>. The second trip will be in the Fall and will be to Tunnel "0" and vicinity. Future choices may include a visit to the Portola Railroad Museum and the Erection Shop at the State Railroad Museum.

Jim Wood presented some slides showing preliminary work on the Colfax caboose. He also briefly discussed the future of the rail coach that has been the home of the Chamber of Commerce, but is now being vacated. A proposal to turn the car into a restaurant appears to have died. It may be possible to eventually have the car reconfigured as a lounge car to be rented out for meetings and other events.

Jim also included in the presentation the use of Google Earth to research historic locations and remains of abandoned railroad facilities and roadbeds.

There was also a presentation of a proposal to participate in a new group that has formed to designate a "Transcontintal Rail Heritage Corridor". It is the purpose of the group to obtain a Historical Transportation Corridor designation from the U.S. Forest Service for the western potion of the original transcontental railroad route. It was decided that the PSRHS would send a letter to the founding organization, supporting their proposal.
