## Monthly Newsletter – June 2009

### June 2009 Meeting:

## **SPECIAL MEETING DATE:**

This months meeting will depart from our normal meeting date and will be held on **Friday June 26<sup>th</sup>**. At our normal time and place. This change is for <u>this</u> <u>month only</u> and is to accommodate the schedule of Jim Mahon who will discuss his role in the dramatic Roseville yard "mishap" when a train carrying bomb ordinance exploded and leveled much of the Antelope train yard In past meeting we have heard other perspectives of this event. Jim will tell us about his role in trying to pull out pieces of the train before they too exploded and his role in rebuilding the yard in the aftermath.

### Field Trip Saturday May 23, 2009:

Our Spring fieldtrip outing on Saturday, May 23<sup>rd</sup>. drew our largest attendance yet with about 30 people including several new guests to our activities. We began our walking tour in the Colfax Union Pacific train yard to look around at some of the odd pieces of maintenance and rail equipment.

The group then moved to the west end or our tour area to the home of Dave McClain to see the semaphore signal that our society purchased recently as well as to view some of Dave's interesting railroad memorabilia.

We then headed east bound over the site of the former Lower Illinoistown Gap Trestle built in 1865. We then began walking on the original Central Pacific Railroad grades that were abandoned during the 1909-10 double tracking of the SP mainline through the Colfax areas. We walked over about 6 abandoned "S" shaped *Vol. 7 / No.6*  sections that now lie on both sides of the current mainline. Evidence of the original CPRR track grades were marked by old Rocklin and Penryn granite culverts beneath the fills, old Central Pacific railroad spikes lying here and there, as well as some original square redwood telegraph poles that paralleled the Central Pacific tracks when constructed in 1865 in the Colfax area.

Following a lunch/refreshment break, the group viewed the caboose restoration effort, looked at the site of a possible future railroad museum and walked to the site of "Oilville" on the Nevada County Narrow Gauge railroad line east of Colfax.

The fine weather this day was enjoyed and we look forward to out Fall outing to look at Cape Horn and vicinity.
