September Program:

Members provided a variety of current and historical photos of the various tunnels and snowsheds over Donner Summit.

The original snowsheds were constructed of wood, and were in constant danger of burning down from fires ignited by hot exhaust coming from the steam locomotive smokestack. The tunnels were eventually all converted to concrete, to reduce this hazard. Currently, there is ongoing tunnel construction to provide for double track over the entire Donner Summit route. The tunnels have to be made higher in order to accommodate the double stack freight cars. Thank you to all members who provided

October Field Trips

Cape Horn Mills:

The October fieldtrip was attended by about 18 of our members with a couple of guests as well. It was a perfectly cool Fall day for a walk along abandoned Central Pacific RR track grades up beyond the Cape Horn area that diverges from the current mainline route. As we walked over and through enormous fills and cuts we could imagine the scene 140 years ago as the early wood burning American locomotives were chugging up these old grades as they wound in and out of the hills toward Donner Pass.

Nearby, we compared historical photographs of the setting at Cape Horn Mills and identified its location fairly well. The current scene hasn't changed too much from the images taken in 1869. Cape Horn Mills was one of several sawmills that supplied the enormous volume of cord wood for the locomotives laboring up to Donner Pass.

We finished the trip by driving over to Secret Town to look at the location of both the town and the historic trestle, which was later filled in by the Chinese in about 1875. Absolutely no trace of the town's location exists today except for old square nails scattered in the soil marking the location of old buildings and cabins.

Mining Museum

We had as good showing of our RR Society members for the visit to the home of Mike Nevius in Nevada City. Mike and his wife LaVita had coffee and donuts waiting for us when we arrived. It took about two hours to see all of Mike's collection.

We had the opportunity to see some of the equipment in operation such as a hydraulic monitor (water canon) as well as a complete gold processing mill consisting of an ore bin, ore crusher, and stamp mill all powered by an authentic antique gas engine typical of the gold mining era.

Mike has restored countless pieces of historic mining equipment such as stamp mills that are displayed in several public parks all over both Nevada and Placer Counties. A fascinating trip and one of our best yet!

November Program:

The November program will be a photo show by Roger Staab, presenting photos of two 2009 AMTRAK trips, the Empire Builder to Montana, and the Coast Starlight to Seattle, with bus and Ferry segments to Vancouver and Victoria BC.
