Field Trip Plans for 2010

Spring: We are planning a trip in July to Virginia City, Nevada for a private tour of the Virginia &Truckee Railroad. Included will be a ride on the V&TRR. The finalized date and plans will be reported in future news.

The Virginia and Truckee Railroad, known as the "Queen of the Short Lines", first rolled in 1870. Its legendary engines and engineers opened the silver hills of Nevada's Comstock Lode through some of the steepest and curviest rail lines in America.

The V&T is now a tourism line, providing visitors with an entertaining ride with both steam and diesel locomotive power. Additional restoration work is ongoing.

Fall Fieldtrip: Exploration of the history of the Towle Brothers Railroad. The Towle Brothers built their first sawmill near Blue

Canyon in 1859 to serve the mining trade. By the late 1860s, their major customer was the Central Pacific railroad, beginning a relationship that continued for many years. In the 1880s, the Towle Bros. began building narrow (three foot) gauge rail lines to haul logs from the forest to mills, and evidence of roadbeds from this era can be found in many locations.

February Program:

Gary Symington from Meadow Vista entertained us with a collection of his oil paintings representing historical locomotives and railroad scenes. He explained how he produces a painting, from his first ideas, to sketches, through the finished painting. He has worked as a graphic designer and illustrator for years, but reports he really enjoys painting trains. Originally, he painted landscapes; but after a visit to the Sacramento State Railroad Museum he became enthralled with the history of railroading, and has been painting trains ever since.

We look forward to seeing more of Gary's work and hope he will paint some local Colfax scenes, including our restored Depot. Thank you for sharing your talent with us, Gary. (Shirley Belleville, Secretary)
