As requested by members we have arranged a tour of the Roseville yard. The tour will be led by Lonnie Dickson, Manager of Operating Practices for the UP. We will meet at 9AM at the main UP RV yard office off of Foothills Blvd. There is a 30 person limit to keep the number of cars to a minimum. V&T RR Field Trip in July:

Our trip will take place on **Sunday**, **July 11.** Trip attendees will meet and depart from Virginia City at 10:30 am in 4x4 vehicles or high clearance vehicles for a guided tour along the reconstructed railroad grade by way of the historic wagon road that parallels the old railroad grade. We will stop a various spots to inspect the engineering of the railroad line. Along the way we'll have a run by of the V&T train. At the Carson City end of the line, we'll board the train and have another personally narrated trip back to Virginia City.

Program:

Video Program: Sierra Shortlines Vol. 2.

A thoroughly enjoyable presentation was shared by all as we viewed a video of historical films collected by Don Olson from 4 old California Shortlines: The Yosemite Valley Railroad Incline Railroad, the Amador Central, the Hetch Hetchy RR, and the Nevada County Narrow Gauge.

Our own Ken Yeo was featured in the NCNG story as he narrated first hand stories and historical events. The line from Grass Valley/Nevada City to Colfax brought out over \$250 million of gold during its early years. It ran freight and passengers from 1876 until it was abandoned in 1942, and was a source of local pride and community concern during its years of operation.

The Yosemite Valley Railroad (1905 – 1945) ran from Merced to El Portal and played an important part in the lumber history of the area. It delivered logs gathered from the old Sugar Pine Incline which was noteworthy for its 67% gradient.

The Amador Central line was only 12 miles long, but had 100+ curves. It carried gold and forest products from Martell near Jackson to Ione during the years (1909 - 2004).

The Hetch Hetchy Railroad (1917 – 1949) was commissioned by the City of San Francisco for the express purpose of construction and expansion of the O'Shaughnessy Dam across the Hetch Hetchy valley. The 68-mile railroad was based in Groveland. (Shirley Belleville, Secretary)

The arranged personalized tour of the V&T Railroad Rebuilding project will be led by Gary Luce of Geocon Inc., the engineering company in charge of the earthwork efforts to rebuild the Line. We'll begin in Virginia City about 9:30 AM in cars and drive the old wagon roads next to the railroad grade to inspect all the major engineering efforts in the reconstruction. At the Carson City end, we'll board the train for the return to Virginia City.

Cost for the trip is \$60 which includes the train ticket and a special guidebook prepared for this trip. Water and sodas will be provided. Everyone should bring a sack lunch and any other snacks.
