# January 2011

**November Meeting:** As usual, our year-end meeting and potluck dinner was well attended with approximately 25 of our members and guests joining us. Special thanks go to Shirley Belleville for her normal well organized dinner preparations.

Meeting business: At the recommendation of the Society Board, the members present unanimously voted to increase the number of Board positions from 8 to 9 people to allow a potential tie breaking capability for voting contingencies as well as accommodating the service of other interested members to serve on the Board.
