



July Meeting Presentation – "Scotland and Northern England - 2011" - Peter Hills

Slide presentation from a recent trip to Scotland and Northern England, including mainline running on the East and West Coast mainlines to London on Virgin Voyager (125 mph) and Virgin Pendolino's (140 mph) trains, plus an HST125 run from Edinburgh to Inverness Scotland, Mainline running also included DMU's through the Lake District and on the Highland West Coast line from Inverness to Kyle of Lochalsh, and Mallaig to Glasgow. Also visited were numerous heritage railway lines including the Weardale and Wensleydale Railways, the North Yorkshire Moors Railway (celebrating its 175th Anniversary) and the 15 inch narrow gauge Ravenglass and Eskdale (celebrating it's 50th Anniversary). Trip also included a visit to the National Railway Museum sites in York and Shildon, and a mainline steam train ride from London to York and return behind LMS Stanier 'Pacific' "Princess Elizabeth" 6201.











From the Archives



Last Month's Mystery Photo: The photo at upper left shows a derailment near the downtown Auburn Depot looking eastbound from the Cherry St. Bridge. At upper right is the same scene in 2003.

For August, Art Sommers offers up a mystery photo taken at that same location. The scene at right appeared on a postcard that was postmarked July 1908. The similar buildings suggest that this photo and the above derailment photo date to the same general era. The mystery, though, is the row of white poles to the right of the train. At far right are two regular poles with cross arms, so the white poles may be telephone or power poles, but why are some of the poles either covered in something white or painted white? CPRR/SP Donner Route Timeline: April 16, 1864 – Placer Herald report on Bloomer Cut Accident: "Yesterday on the deep cut of the of the Pacific Railroad, near town, some of the workmen under the superintendence of Mr. Trowbridge [sic] attempted to set off a blast containing about 50 pounds of powder. From some cause it failed, when Mr. T. [sic], and two of the hands, - a Portugese and a Frenchman - commenced using a crowbar or drill upon the hole, when the blast went off suddenly, mutilating them in a horrible manner, especially the Portugese who is not expected to recover; but Mr. Trobridge [sic] will, with probably the loss of his left eye."
