November Program: Railroad photographer Stan Kistler will narrate his slideshow "Fifty Years of Chasing Trains (With a Camera)." His presentation will cover his personal railroad photography chronologically from 1945 to 1995 all over the west as well as Canada and Mexico. This promises to be an excellent and informative program to cap off an eventful year.

Recap of Fall Fieldtrip to Penryn/Newcastle: Saturday, Oct. 15

The railroad history of Penryn and Newcastle became the backup venue of our Fall fieldtrip on October 15 when early snow on the summit and uncertain access conditions caused us to postpone Coldstream Canyon for another day.

A group of members who weren't on the 2007 visit to Penryn met with guest historian Cliff Kennedy at the Griffith Quarry to learn the history of close relationship of the early CPRR construction with the local quarryman, Griffith Griffith. With the aid of a lot of "arm waving" and Google Earth photos, the group decided on the precise location of some early photographs that captured an official visit of an entourage of CPRR officials to Penryn in 1864 when Newcastle was "end of track".

Later, the group moved up the hill to Newcastle where similar early photos showed the same entourage of officials at the end of track watching the road engine Conness being turned for its return to Sacramento. Our group trudged through the brambles to look for clues to the location of the original Newcastle trestle and roadbed alignments prior to double tracking in 1908. As usual, the group always finds evidence of the original roadbed when early CPRR spikes are kicked up.

2011 - A Look Back

Colfax Railroad Days Update

PSRHS Treasurer Peter Hills reports the following final accounting of costs and revenues for the Colfax Railroad Days event.

Expenses \$6191
Revenues \$5054

The bulk of the expenses were the per-diem and lodging for the team of volunteers who traveled with and staffed the Portola museum's WP historic train, liability insurance for activities on UP property, and advertising and printing.



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Colfax Railroad Days (continued) The Portola museum's historic train was a big hit with visitors, but the expenses for such an event are significant. To bring the train here, PSRHS raised money through donations, ticket sales and a raffle, but our fund-raising efforts fell short of meeting expenses by \$1137. Further fundraising needs to be done to cover this past-year's costs and for events and activities to be held in 2012.

Caboose Reconstruction Status and Funding

In addition to Railroad Days expenses, the caboose reconstruction project is experiencing funding shortfalls, caused in large part by expenses for changing out the electrical service before caboose work could begin. Donations totaling \$268 were collected at the caboose during Railroad Days. Project manager Tony Hesch reports the remaining caboose fund balance of \$2618 is being used to purchase custom siding for the half of the

caboose currently being worked on. The siding and newly fabricated windows will be installed, and some interior and metal work will

be completed. The project will then go into winter break, subject to weather conditions and raising

funds needed to purchase additional materials.




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From the Archives

Last Month's Mystery Photo: This view of Auburn's Nevada Street station shows its distinct hip-roof style. The building went into service after double-tracking in 1911 resulted in the new eastbound track bypassing the downtown Auburn depot.





The photo at left shows this same roof style on the building now being used to store hay at Echo Valley Ranch feed store on Nevada St. in Auburn. It is located about a mile west of the present-day Blocker Drive AMTRAK Capital Corridor station.

CPRR/SP Donner Route Timeline: June 1864: Tracks reached Newcastle in May, 1864, and the first revenue train between Sacramento and Newcastle operated on June 3, 1864. Central Pacific RR Time Card No. 1 took effect June 6, 1864 at 5AM. Three trains each way were listed. with two of them operating daily except Sunday, and one operating daily. Work was underway on the next major obstacles, the Newcastle trestle and Bloomer Cut.
