#### **Colfax Railroad Days Planning Meeting**

Club president Jim Wood convened a meeting at Peter Hills' home on July 9 to discuss our club's plans for the 2012 Colfax Railroad Days, Oct. 6-7. Jim reported that UP wants insurance in place by Sept. 1 for our activities that will take place on UP property. In particular, insurance for the motor car rides is being priced from several sources, along with the feasibility of getting an umbrella policy to supplement the motor car insurance.

Cost figures for bringing the Porter locomotive to Railroad Days were discussed, with the conclusion that our club does not have the funds to bring the Porter locomotive this year. The information will be forwarded to the Colfax Area Chamber of Commerce to see if they want to raise the funds to bring it here this year.

The major activities we will be involved with for this year's event include:

- 1. UP equipment in the main yard (by the fruit sheds). We will sell tickets to this display, and control the flow of people to see the equipment. The Operation Lifesaver booth will likely be located near the UP displays. POC's Lonnie Dickson and Jim Wood.
- 2. Motor Car Rides on the spur near the freight depot. POC's Peter Hills and Malcolm Frost
- 3. The caboose will be open for tours and information about the club and our activities. POC Tony Hesch
- 4. Brendan Compton will show railroad films at Sierra Vista Center (the Colfax Theater will not be available).
- 5. Sacramento Valley Live Steamers, will again bring their ride-on steam-powered trains to the ball field near Sierra Vista Center. POC Bill Yoder

To raise funds to cover insurance and other expenses, we discussed ticket sales and decided to sell a single pass for all events, including the live steamers. The pass will have a map on it of all the major activities, and boxes to get checked at each venue. A completed

pass can be exchanged for a raffle ticket. Walt Wilson agreed to prepare a mock-up of the pass.

A raffle will be held to raise additional funds. Donations of railroad-related items or artwork are being sought. Malcolm Frost will set up a raffle page on our web site to increase interest and participation.

We will need volunteers to sell passes and raffle tickets, control flow of visitors to the UP displays, and to staff the motor car rides, movie showings, and caboose. The live steamers group will provide their own staffing. Roger Staab will coordinate volunteer recruitment and assignments to ensure that all venues are covered, and to give volunteers breaks and a chance to enjoy the activities.

On June 9 we were given a tour of the Roseville Diesel shop and part of the area around it by the UP shop foreman. The tour started in the conference room with a discussion of the rotary rebuild and several war stories. We then proceeded to the shop area, toured 7113 (in for repair). Then the rotaries, and toured inside a rebuilt flanger. We then walked past a large group of repair parts stocked there and thru the old shop where a flanger was being rebuilt. May Mystery Photo: The photo at right shows a westbound cab-forward passing the Clipper Gap depot. The road crossing is just beyond the depot. The photo below left shows this same station looking west (toward today's I-80). Note the house at the far left, and compare it with the photo at lower right showing the same house and roof line at the left edge of the photo, and Clipper Gap road crossing the



**CPRR/SP Donner Route Timeline:** Two miles from Colfax, the route rapidly gained elevation. At Cape Horn, the roadbed was carved out of a cliff. Reports indicating that Chinese workers were dangled over the cliffs in baskets have largely been disproved by analysis of the slopes. This conclusion does not diminish the accomplishment, however. Cape Horn was an engineering feat that cemented Strobridge's faith in the Chinese workers. No lives were lost in constructing this section of the CPRR.

Passing Scene - SIERRA HOTEL, eastbound in Colfax in 2010 on the rear of AMTRAK #6. Built in 1948 by the Budd Company for the California Zephyr and named Silver Lounge. Originally configured as a dome-dormitory-coffee shop car that provided overnight accommodations for the train service staff. The car operated in Amtrak service until 1980. It has been totally rebuilt by its current owners. The dormitory was replaced with bedrooms, the coffee shop became a luxurious observation lounge, and an open platform was added.
