We will plan on assembling the group at Sonol Depot at about 10am for the earliest train departure. Specific

time will be announced by our June meeting. Lunch options are available at the local cafes. Doug Debs of the Niles group will organize shop tours for our group. He informs us that Saturday is the best day for tours as a full work crew is on hand working on the various projects.

The cost for the train trip is \$12 adults, \$10 seniors, \$7 children. Spouses and Guests are welcome to join us. We'll try to pair those people that would like to carpool.

#### **Recap of May Meeting Presentation**

**Roger Staab** gave a slideshow with highlights from his book on **Towle Brothers** recently published by PSRHS. Towle Brothers operated a narrow gauge logging railroad in Placer and Nevada counties that eventually reached over 30 miles into Nevada county timberland. They also founded the town of Towle to support their logging and lumber operations. Roger's presentation described the evolution of their railroad, town, and family businesses that made up the company. book includes newspaper quotes providing first-hand accounts of rides on their railroad and other equipment, and operations of their mills and factories.

Book sales to date have yielded over \$400 for PSRHS historic preservation and education projects. Copies of the book can be purchased on line – see the Store tab on the www.psrhs.org web site. Help spread the word and contribute to this PSRHS fund-raising effort.

### **Summary of May 28 Board Meeting**

The meeting was called to order by President Malcolm Frost. Malcolm reported that the caboose account has a balance of about \$6100, and the club's quicken account has a balance of \$2570.

Web Site: The club's web page now has live twitter feeds of the most recent trains through Colfax.



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Railroad Days: No real news. We have a commitment from UP to participate but no commitment on what specific equipment they will bring this year. One suggestion was to request that they bring the 9900 Clean Air engine and tout UP's environmental efforts.

Motor cars will not run again this year. Insurance is too costly to make it practical.

The event will be promoted at the state fair with a flyer.

Ideas to get more people to the Sierra Vista center activities included a tethered hot air balloon ride with ads, better signs on I-80, and improved maps.

Web Cams: Brendan is proceeding with plans to install up to 3 web cams in Colfax in conjunction with Wave Broadband. Costs and line-of-site connections are being weighed to decide if the first trial camera will show the tracks through town or Cape Horn. Ads to offset costs of operating the web cams may be easier to sell if the camera shows Colfax, but a Cape Horn camera might generate more viewer interest.

Rotary Film: Brendan's rotary snowplow film will air on PBS in October. PBS will offer it for national distribution to member stations. PSRHS will be able to offer sales of the video after it airs.

### From the Archives

**May Photo:** The train in the photo at right was on the Lake Tahoe pier at Tahoe City. Originally built using the Bliss family's logging railroad track and equipment, the Lake Tahoe branch line began operation as a narrow gauge railroad in 1900, connecting the SP mainline in Truckee with Lake Tahoe steamers at the pier in Tahoe City. The line operated seasonally from May 15-Nov. 15. The photo below taken from the pier shows the train arriving at Tahoe City.





The line was leased to SP in 1925. SP converted it to standard gauge and operated it for the next two decades. Today a bike path follows the old right-of-way from Squaw Valley to Tahoe City. **CPRR/SP Donner Route Timeline:** In November 1869, UP sold 48.5 miles of its track east of Promontory Summit to the CP and leased another 5.5 miles. This allowed the CP to operate its trains from Sacramento to Ogden. The official junction between the two railroads was formally changed to Ogden from Promontory in December 1869. The CP rebuilt some 10 miles of the original UP grade east of Promontory Summit (on grade CP had surveyed) in 1870, replacing some of the UP's steep grades and tight curves.
