

Passing Scene





This month's Passing Scene features the rapidly changing appearance of the Colfax caboose in downtown Colfax. Tony Hesch and his crew have stripped and replaced the tongue and groove siding on the street side of the caboose over the past two months. The top photo taken in October 2014 showed the badly deteriorated condition of the final unfinished side. In the middle photo taken in late January 2015 the old siding had been removed, and installation of new siding was underway. The lower photo taken earlier this month shows new siding installed, window openings cut and new windows and sills in place. Work remaining includes side windows of the cupola, fascia boards, exterior metal hardware, new roofing, and interior sanding and painting. 

January Mystery Photos:

The Newcastle trestle, 528 feet long and 60 feet high, was completed in late 1864. The trestle was filled in 1876. In 1909 the ravine crossing was relocated slightly northeast to its present site on new fill as part of the double-tracking project. The present-day railroad bridge that crosses I-80 was added when the freeway was constructed.

February Mystery Photo:

Joe Halton provided this month's photo, a change of pace from recent mystery photos. Where were these tracks located, and what did they serve? What was the motive power? Hint – the scene was not on the Donner Route, but was located not too far away.



CPRR/SP Donner Route Timeline: In 1911 the hillside at the south edge of Colfax was cut away to make way for the new double tracks, a large yard and engine house southwest of Grass Valley Street. At several locations along the double tracking project the new track and old track ran close to each other. Some sections of the winding original roadbed that hugged the hillsides were abandoned and the old tracks moved to the new straightened alignment. Many of these abandoned roadbed segments can be found today along the route.
