We are fresh off another successful Colfax Railroad Days celebration. Many thanks to the small core team involved in planning and coordinating activities, and those who volunteered time on the days of the event.

Friday Night Dinner Sept. 11

The event kicked off with a BBQ dinner Friday night at the passenger depot. Colfax Lions took on the task of organizing the dinner. The evening included good food and conversation, raffle drawings, reading of historical moments, and entertaining music.

Railroad Days Saturday and Sunday Sept. 12-13

The main event started Saturday morning with setup of the many venues. The week's heat wave relented a bit

on Saturday -- hot but not too hot. Smoke from area wildfires was a bit of an issue, but did not deter a steady stream of visitors for both days of the event.

Union Pacific provided a sparkling clean set of equipment including a rotary plow and its B unit, a flanger, modern diesel locomotive, and maintenance of way equipment, all available for guests to tour and hear from experts who operate or have operated the equipment. Thanks Union Pacific for providing a great show for our event attendees.

The putt-putt antique engines were a big hit as always. Four model RR layouts attracted lots of attention, two downtown and two at Sierra Vista Center. Also at SVCC were railroad art, kids zone, and the ride-on steam train in the ballfield. Railroad movies were featured at the Colfax Theater. A big hit at the PSRHS booth was the Thomas the Tank engine layout that kids of all ages could operate. The newly renovated caboose was open for visitors, and a car show was held nearby on Main Street. Once again we provided a shuttle train from the caboose area to Sierra Vista Center.

Numerous Arts & Crafts booths and two food trucks set up in the freight depot lot, along with yummy gelato at the passenger depot. Other booths featured Empire Mine, NCNG RR, Operation Lifesaver, CHP, Placer County Sheriff, International Railfair, Lions, Boy Scouts, PG&E, Colfax High Engineering Arts Team (they also provided volunteers to assist us), Siemens Rail Systems, California High Speed Rail Authority, and a monument dedicated to Chinese workers.

Railroad T-shirts sold like hotcakes at the PSRHS booth, and raffle tickets were a popular item with AMTRAK tickets to Reno offered as a grand prize.

I'm sure I missed mentioning somone and if so I apologize but you get the idea.

It was a lot of work putting on the event, but those of us who were involved feel we provided a festive party to celebrate Colfax's 150 years as a Railroad Town.
