Highlights of February Board Meeting

The PSRHS board of directors met on Feb. 23 prior to the regular member meeting. Items discussed include:

Colfax Caboose – Ken Young reported that caboose work days will occur March 8 and every second Saturday from 9am-1pm. Plan is to have the work completed and the caboose open by the City's July 3 event. Ken presented a proposed charter for the Caboose committee to provide oversight of caboose renovations and displays, and report to the PSRHS board. The committee was approved by the board. A meeting of the committee will be held March 16 at 7pm in the Colfax City Council Chambers.

Railroad Days – The board voted to host a Colfax Railroad Days event in 2019 to commemorate the 150th anniversary of completion of the transcontinental railroad. There was further discussion on whether to host an event prior to 2019. The club has lost money on each of the past four events. Members are assessing the possibility of a smaller event in 2017 without UP equipment if appropriate displays and locations can be secured. A report will be provided at the next meeting.

Roger Staab reported that he is working on an Arcadia book with Art Sommers titled Railroads of Placer

County. Photos from the PSRHS collection will be used along with Art's photos. Half of the royalties from sales of the book will go to PSRHS activities.

The board of directors will meet at 5:30pm Thursday, March 23 prior to the regular monthly meeting. PSRHS members and visitors are welcome to attend board meetings.

Air Medical Response Benefit for Members

At our February meeting Sonja Conklin discussed the costs that may be incurred if you need air ambulance service, and how those costs are greatly reduced if you have membership in CALSTAR/REACH Air Medical Services. She offered the club the opportunity to apply for a rate reduction for club members. That has been implemented and PSRHS members can get a yearly membership for \$55 per household, a \$10 savings. Some of our members report that you can add extended family members to the plan at no additional cost even if they reside elsewhere, such as students at college, etc.

Current members were sent an email notice on how to apply for the discount rate.

New Issue Of Donner Crossings

The Spring 2017 issue of Donner Crossings was mailed last Friday to current members. This issue tells the story of two narrow-gauge locomotives, how their paths were separate but intertwined as they served lines along the Donner route, and their ultimate fate.


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From the Archives

February Mystery Photo (right): Many of you recognize this photo as the wooden Long Ravine Trestle and Bridge, built in 1866. There are clues in the photo that identify the approximate date. Montague's Chief Engineer's Report of 1877 stated that in 1876 the Long Ravine Trestle was filled in. Since the trestle is still exposed in this image, the photo was taken before 1876. The NCNG tracks were constructed under the bridge portion in late 1875 and they are not evident in the photo. Finally the bridge portion was originally exposed timbers but was covered around 1873, suggesting this Houseworth photo was likely taken in 1873, 1874 or 1875. *PSRHS Collection*

Accidents/Other Incidents. JANUARY 28 1937 A westbound rotary snow plow consist was rear-ended by a westbound freight at Blue Canon. Both were powered by cab-forward locomotives. The plow had stopped just west of a signal to put out a fire in the plow and build up steam. Weather was snowing and blowing with about 10 feet of snow on the ground. A flagman was posted the proper distance behind the stopped plow. The westbound freight had picked up a relief crew so there were 6 people in the cab. The engineer did try to stop the train when he saw the flagman but the freight hit the stopped plow at approximately 8 MPH, damaging both engines, injuring 6 employees and derailing six cars. The investigation determined the cause to be failure to observe automatic block-signal indications and to obey the stop signals of a flagman. Report provided by Phil Smith from the Tortoise Tattler
