PSRHS Fall Field Trip

Our Fall club field trip on October 28 offered 16 of our members a rare opportunity to see two very unique private railroad memorabilia collections. Dick Dorn's collection focuses principally on vintage signaling equipment. His fully operating pieces straddle a section of track that gives an attractive context to them. His full size replica of an SP #23 depot resembles the one in Yuba City. It houses an extensive collection of depot and trackside signs and switch lamps.

Les, Cindy and Casey Wilmunder welcomed our group with a BBQ while viewing their unique collection of prototype narrow gauge locomotives and freight cars. The anchor of their collection is the restored and operable Porter locomotive and the Heisler (under restoration). Both engines operated years ago at the tourist railroad at Camino in El Dorado County by Les's late father, Hal, and our own Ken Yeo. This eclectic collection also includes an original San Francisco Cable Car and a Central Pacific velocipede, plus a plethora of other fascinating pieces too numerous to mention.



October Mystery Photo (right): This circa 1911 photo was taken from the top of the west portal of newly completed Tunnel 18 looking west toward Newcastle. The double tracks cross the ravine on a new fill. The old curved roadbed (former wood trestle covered with fill) can be seen to the left of the new tracks. This is another of the 200 photos featured in the new Arcadia book, Railroads of Placer County, by Art Sommers and Roger Staab, to be published Jan. 15. 2018. The book provides a short history of 14 railroads that operated in Placer County through the years, some for only a short time or distance, others for many years, with a major one still operating today.

Accidents/Other Incidents. Heroic Brakeman Prevents Wreck – John Horen Stops Runaway Cars on Colfax Grade and Saves Train. DUTCH FLAT (Placer Co.), June 13. – The steady nerve and heroism of John Horen, a freight brakeman, probably prevented a disastrous wreck last night, when the caboose and several cars of local freight train No. 210 ran down the grade at Toll (sic). The cars were left uncoupled at that place and started down the grade, gaining momentum. Horen stayed with the train and succeeded in stopping it on the Colfax grade after it had attained a speed of more than 60 miles an hour.

Conductor Smith was in charge of the train. It was feared that the cars would collide with No. 2, the limited passenger train. Fortunately the train was a few minutes late. Sacramento Union, 14 June 1913
