April Program: Tom Shook will discuss Siemens' past projects/vehicles, the current projects/vehicles in manufacturing today and what is on the horizon. Tom is supplier quality engineer and travels around the world qualifying new suppliers, performing first article inspections, and supporting factory operations in Sacramento for light rail vehicles, locomotives, and passenger coaches by resolving supplier quality issues.

March Program: Roger Staab presented a slide show titled Railroad Scenes Then and Now Along the Donner Pass Route. Historic photos were paired with contemporary photos showing nearly the same locations as they appear today.

Golden Spike 150th Transcontinental Railroad Sesquicentennial Celebration

Progress is continuing on getting UP's #4014 Big Boy steam locomotive ready to appear under its own power at Ogden in May. The UP Steam Team reports that for the first time in 60 years a UP 4000 class locomotive has fire in its firebox in Cheyenne ... an oil fire. On April 9 a fire was successfully lit in the firebox of UP 4014, in preparation for additional testing of the modified oil conversion for Big Boy 4014.

On Thursday, May 9, at 10:30 am MDT, Union Pacific will host a celebration marking the 150th anniversary of the transcontinental railroad's completion. The ceremony will be held at Ogden Union Station a day ahead of Utah's celebration at Promontory Summit where the Golden Spike was originally tapped into place. The May 9 ceremony will feature Living Legend No. 844 and Big Boy No. 4014. The two will meet, recreating the historic image taken at Promontory Summit on May 10, 1869.

Promontory Summit in Utah will be host to a ceremony on May 10, along with other activities and celebrations

Accidents/Other Incidents. Sacramento Daily Union, 20 March 1899 – KILLED IN A TRAIN WRECK – A LOCOMOTIVE PLUNGES SEVENTY-FIVE FEET – Engineer Witham and Fireman Gray Meet Death in a Clipper Gap Disaster – A special westbound freight train was wrecked near Clipper Gap Station at an early hour yesterday morning. Engineer Fred M. Witham and Fireman Edward Gray were killed, assistant Fireman P. De Souza and Brakeman G. L. Beeler were slightly hurt, and many cars and the head locomotive were wrecked. The latter plunged down a 75-foot embankment, but the second one did not leave the roadbed. ... The engine struck a horse at a point a quarter of a mile beyond Clipper Gap, but I doubt whether the engineer ever knew it. The horse had broken from a shed to which it had been tied ... It dragged a plank after it, which was tied to the halter, and when it attempted to cross the track the animal was held fast there by the plank, which caught on the rail ... The two front guide wheels of the large twelve wheel locomotive were thrown off the track, the other pair remaining all right, but when the train came to the Clipper Gap switch the front guide wheels did not take the rods, and the forward locomotive was ditched and thrown down a 75-foot embankment.
