

July Program: Eric Walker of California Operation Lifesaver will speak about rail safety. Walker's interest in trains began when he took his first train ride from California to Louisiana in 1966. Safety has also been among his long-time priorities and CAOL gives him an opportunity to continue to keep others safe while on or around railroad tracks. He is passionate about safety and has a goal to reduce the number of incidents involving pedestrians and vehicles with rail safety education.

Walker was in law enforcement for 30 years. He retired as a Sergeant from the Sacramento Police Department and has been with CAOL since 2014. He is currently a Grade Crossing Inspector for the Federal Railroad Administration.

June Program Recap: Keith Pattison spoke about mapmaking with a focus on maps of early logging railroads and flumes to support mines in the Tahoe area. He discussed mapmaking tips and tricks he has learned along the way, and ideas for sources for finding old railroad grades and planning trips to the field.

Keith has created several dozen maps of old logging railroads, water systems and flumes. He displayed many of them at the meeting and offered copies for sale to those who were interested.

A return visit to the many historic sites at or near Donner Summit is being planned for our fall field trip tentatively set for October 19. Watch for details in future issues of the newsletter.



Passing Scene - AMTRAK Modified Equipment

In dusting off old photos I ran across this one I took in May 2014 in Colfax. The train configuration seemed odd along with knowing that style of locomotive hadn't been used by AMTRAK for several years. Further research on AMTRAK #90229 yielded some interesting information. These EMD F40PH cowl-bodied diesel locomotives were built for AMTRAK in the 1980's. When they were replaced by the Genesis locomotives in the late 1990's, some of these F40PH units including #90229 were rebuilt by AMTRAK into non-powered 'Cabbage' cars (Control cab/baggage car, or NPCU). NPCU's can be identified from the standard F40PH by the lack of grills and rooftop fans as the baggage area has now replaced the standard engine room. NPCUs were commonly seen on Amtrak's "Downeaster" leading southbound trains, and were also seen on Amtrak's "Pere Marquette", "Wolverine", "Blue Water", "Cascades", "Pacific Surfliner", and "San Joaquin".

Further trivia for this car: AMTRAK #90229 was the last NPCU in Phase 4 paint, but was overhauled and repainted in Phase 5 paint in May 2014. 90229 was also the only NPCU to be equipped with a *Nathan Airchime* P5A horn, but during overhaul it was re-equipped with a K5LA. *Photo by Roger Staab*

Accidents/Other Incidents. San Francisco Chronicle, Apr 16, 1895. Planned to Rob Dead. Full details of the attempt to wreck the east-bound passenger train at Colfax last night were received at the division headquarters here today. The two tramps who warned the agent at Colfax of the attempted wreck were taken into custody by Sheriff Conroy. They gave their names as Connally and Thompson. They had been put off the train at Gold Run yesterday and failing to catch another train, decided to walk to Sacramento. When a mile west of Colfax they say they found three men at work on the rails and the wreckers immediately fled when the tramps appeared. The train was due at that point at 1:50 o'clock this morning, and if it had gone over the embankment it would have fallen into a deep canyon, and the loss of life would have been terrible....

The railroad officials are of the opinion that it was the intention of the wreckers to rob the dead and injured after the train had been buried down the mountainside. There is also the opinion that the two men who carried the news into Colfax had themselves withdrawn the spikes and bolts and then notified the agent in the hopes of being liberally rewarded by the railroad company. Such things have been done before.
