CENTRAL PACIFIC COACH #12 SAVED

Last month's newsletter provided a detailed history of Central Pacific coach #12, along with efforts by a group of railroad history buffs to save the car from potential destruction unless it could be removed from the Calistoga depot building to make way for a restaurant. Through the tireless efforts of Scott Inman and several others, the car was saved. Scott provided this

summary of the actions and players who helped save the car.

"Some of you may have heard the good news that we were successful in saving CP 12 from Calistoga on Thursday ... From the charitableness of the depot's owner who gave us CP 12, to the benefactor of the history center who pledged the financial resources to save the car, and the leadership at CSRM who offered their assistance to store this treasure, it seemed like the puzzle pieces all fell into place at just the right time to save the car. Special thanks to Kyle Wyatt for providing the history of the coach that raised awareness in the community, and to Ralph Domenici for his leg work and trips to Calistoga to work with the depot contractor on a plan for the car's removal."

Scott provided several photos of the car's move which can be found on page 3 of this newsletter. Kudos to Scott and all who contributed to saving this treasured piece of railroad history. Passing Scene - CP Coach #12 Saved

The photos on this page were provided by Scott Inman to document the retrieval of CP Coach #12 from the Calistoga Southern Pacific Depot (see article on page 2). The car was at risk of being dismantled to make room for a restaurant in the building's remodeled interior. The first five photos were taken by Scott while the last two were taken by Al Di Paolo.











CP Coach #12 was extracted from the Calistoga SP Depot building through a modified wall. Scott Heavy Movers loaded the car onto a flatbed trailer and transported it to Sacramento. A benefactor covered the expenses of extracting and moving the car and repairing the building.

CP #12 was delivered to Old Town Sacramento and placed in one of the shop bays provided by CSRM, its new home while the historic railcar awaits fundraising to pay for its restoration.





August Mystery Photo (right): This Thomas Houseworth image shows the Long Ravine wood bridge and curved trestle looking westbound. Construction of the bridge and trestle was completed in the spring of 1866. The trestle portion was filled in ten years later, and the wood bridge portion was replaced with an iron bridge or viaduct in 1890. A second steel bridge was added in 1913-14. *PSRHS collection*.

Accidents/Other Incidents. Los Angeles Herald, 2 Apr 1906. "LANDSLIDE CAUSES WRECK – Overland No. 3 Goes in the Ditch Above Cape Horn – Wrecking Crews at Work. By Associated Press. Auburn, April 1. No. 3 Overland was wrecked above Cape Horn by a landslide this morning. One engine was derailed, the baggage car turned over and three other cars derailed. One man's leg was slightly hurt. Two wrecking crews are at work."
